The backing from the LGBTQ community in the Central Valley and other leading activists around the state comes at a time when the LGBTQ community is under attack across the country, as evidenced by the Trump team's abysmal attitude toward transgender youth.

As executive director for Emerge California, Ellis' work (emphasizing a need to ensure more demographic diversity in elected offices, including recruiting LGBTQ women) showcases a track record of commitment to

issues that have gotten the notice of the LGBTQ community and other social justice organizations.

Emerge California has trained more than 400 women, with over 75 percent accomplished under Ellis' leadership. Over half have already run for or been appointed to office with a nearly 70 percent overall win rate. Of that number, half of the Emerge alumnae are women of color, with 12 percent identifying as LGBTQ.

"It's a tremendous honor to have the unanimous support of so many good Democrats who are working tirelessly in Tulare County, as well as the many leading activists throughout the state who are supporting my campaign," Ellis said. "Sexual orientation and gender expression are not the only parts of us that define who we are - but tragically that's the only lens through which the world chooses to view many people. The arguments being put forth today about bathroom use are the same ones used 60 years ago about water fountains. Hate may take new forms, but it really never changes."
