Regina Bateson's Congressional campaign raises more than Rep. McClintock in fourth quarter

JANUARY 31, 2018 (Roseville, Calif.) – The Bateson for Congress campaign successfully outraised four-term Congressman Tom McClintock (R-Elk Grove) in the fourth quarter that ended Dec. 31. The Bateson campaign raised nearly \$45,000 more than Congressman McClintock. The \$260,000 raised by the Bateson campaign was raised completely from grassroots donors, while Tom McClintock took in more than \$28,000 from PACs and special interests.

The Bateson campaign demonstrated its continued grassroots support by raising more than \$70,000 from donations of less than \$200 compared to the roughly \$44,000 McClintock raised from small donors (\$200 or less).

“Voters are clearly fed up with Representative Tom McClintock, and I am proud that our grassroots donors are showing that,” Bateson said.

More than 2,100 individual contributors donated to the campaign during the quarter, and the campaign has now raised more than \$450,000 – four times more than Democrats raised in the 2016 Congressional election cycle in California's 4th Congressional District.

Bateson – who has been endorsed by local leaders Gina Garbolino, the former mayor of Roseville, and Paige Stauss, a member of the Roseville Joint Union High School District board of trustees, as well as former Democratic Congressional candidate Pat Malberg and dozens of other community leaders from across the district – is running to unseat incumbent McClintock.

The Bateson for Congress campaign launched in the spring, and it features:

- a strong campaign team on the ground in the district, including two full-time staff.
- more than 660 volunteers who have registered with the campaign and are working on behalf of Bateson's effort to unseat McClintock.
- victories in straw polls at local Democratic Party events across the district including the Placer Womens Democrats, Placer Stonewall Democrats, the Democrats of Sun City Roseville, Auburn Area Democrats, Truckee-Tahoe Democrats and the United Democrats of El Dorado County

Bateson is a proud native of the 4th District, and she attended local public schools in the Roseville area. While in school, she worked as an ice cream scooper, a sandwich maker and a softball umpire. She also

volunteered at Sutter Roseville Medical Center. She went on to earn her BA from Stanford University and her PhD from Yale University. After 9/11, determined to serve her country, she became a Foreign Service Officer for the State Department. She later became a tenure-track professor. Now she has stepped away from her career to run against McClintock. She and her husband are raising their three sons in Roseville.
