



In SD 22, Mike Eng's lead grows as more ballots are counted — and results show Mike beat Rubio in her own Assembly District

Mike's lead continues to climb, now at 46% to 26% over Susan Rubio despite nearly \$1.3 million in Independent Expenditures benefitting her

The L.A. County Registrar-Recorder counted over 80,000 ballots last Friday and another 120,000+ Tuesday, and with approximately 310,000 ballots still to be processed County-wide former Assemblymember Mike Eng increased his lead in the 22nd State Senate district:

Mike Eng	46%
Susan Rubio	26%
Monica Garcia	21%
Ruben Sierra	8%

The next update from the Registrar will be Friday afternoon, June 15.

Here's what the results in SD 22 reveal:

- Mike is beating Rubio 46%-26% overall, and he's winning in her own Assembly District 48. These results reflect an extremely broad multiethnic and broad geographical coalition in support of Mike.
- Mike is ahead of Rubio in twelve of the fourteen cities in Senate District 22. (Alhambra, Arcadia, Azusa, Covina, El Monte, Industry, Irwindale, Monterey Park, Rosemead, San Gabriel, South El Monte, Temple City, West Covina)
- Mike is ahead of Rubio in the largest cities in her home base of AD 48, West Covina and El Monte, by 10%.
- Mike is ahead in seven of the nine unincorporated areas of the district, too.

Overall, Mike Eng showed strength in every part of the district, despite facing spending on behalf of Rubio totaling well over \$1.66 million. He ran on the strength of his experience, organizational endorsements and local endorsements, including incumbent State Senator Ed Hernandez, Congressmembers Grace Napolitano and Judy Chu, County Supervisor Hilda Solis, and more than 100 local elected leaders from the San Gabriel Valley.

L.A. Mayor Eric Garcetti, who endorsed Mike too late in the campaign to be included in mail and media, has 70%+ favorable ratings in the San Gabriel Valley. His endorsement will be included in the General election campaign.
