ANA MARIA QUINTANA TO RUN IN 33rd SENATE DISTRICT

Bell Vice Mayor Ana Maria Quintana today submitted documents to run for State Senate in California's 33rd district.

Quintana grew up in the 33rd district. No other candidate can match her legal, economic development, labor, and political experience, giving her appeal throughout the district and across political ideologies:

- City Council Member in Bell since 2011, who helped restore local government after a corruption scandal;
- Municipal attorney, working with several jurisdictions in the 33rd SD;
- Real estate developer;
- Substitute teacher at Bell High School and Southeast High School;
- Union organizer with the United Farm Workers (UFW), AFL-CIO and Service Employees International Union (SEIU); and
- B.A. from Yale University, J.D. from Columbia University, and M.A. from Universidad de Navarra (Spain).

"I'm running for Senate because the Southeast cities and Long Beach need a representative who understands their dreams and aspirations, and who has a proven record of making government work for every community," said Quintana.

"I've helped create jobs, lowered taxes for working families, increased accountability, and cleaned up City Hall," she added. "In the State Senate, I'll keep fighting for those same things."

In the reporting period that ended December 31, 2018, Quintana's campaign raised \$120,000.

The 33rd Senate District is comprised of Cudahy, Bell, Bell Gardens, Lynwood, Maywood, Signal Hill, Paramount, South Gate, Vernon, Walnut Park, Huntington Park, and portions of Long Beach Lakewood and Los Angeles.
